Wilde Investigations series

In an alternate London where magic and mundane blend, Yannia Wilde is the PI to turn to when no one else can help.

Within New London sits Old London, as magical folk refer to what's otherwise known as the City of London borough. New London seems much like the city we know, but cross the border into Old London and everything changes: Animal Shamans mix with elemental Mages, and Paladins bear bejewelled swords and Kevlar armour. We are among the Fair Folk, immortal spirits, and disturbing unnamed menaces. The air contains magic and the crimes defy reason. While each London bleeds into the other, the difference is palpable to Yannia Wilde.

Leaving behind the safety and comfort of her people, the Wild Folk, and her conclave deep in the northern forests, Yannia has set up a private investigation business in the heart of Old London. She takes on cases where not everything is as simple as it might seem. From spell-cloaked infidelity to disappearing corpses, Yannia's cases have one thing in common: magic is at work.



Though she must make regular trips to nature to "recharge", Yannia has chosen to live in the outside world because her fierce independence rails against what her father has decided on her behalf, and because her daily life is plagued with the pain of a chronic illness and she needs the relief that only modern medicine can provide. Along with her investigations, she must also navigate her place in the magical hierarchy and class system, uphold the rituals that make her who she is, battle loneliness, and stay true to her nature while she carves out a place for herself where she is one of a kind.

Laura Laakso is a Finn who has lived for most of her adult life in England. She is an accountant, dog trainer, and author.

Laura's third novel *Roots of Corruption* was long-listed in the inaugural Barbellion Prize (2020). The Barbellion Prize is dedicated to the furtherance of ill and disabled voices in writing. The prize is awarded annually to an author whose work has best represented the experience of chronic illness and/or disability.

1. Fallible Justice Laura Laakso


"I am running through the wilderness and the wilderness runs through me."

Those origins lend her the sensory abilities of all of nature. Yet Yannia is lonely and struggling to adapt to life in the city. The case could be the break she needs. She enlists the help of her only friend, a Bird Shaman named Karrion, and together they accept the challenge of proving a guilty man innocent.

So begins a breathless race against time and against all conceivable odds. Can Yannia and Karrion save a man who has been judged infallibly guilty?

2. Echo Murder Laura Laakso


"I'm part of every bird I meet, and they are all within me."

Back in London, unassuming office worker Tim Wedgebury is surprised when police appear on his doorstep with a story about how he was stabbed in the West End. Given that Tim is alive and well, the police chalk the first death up to a Mage prank. But when Tim "dies" a second time, Detective Inspector Jamie Manning calls Yannia and, torn between returning to the life she has built in Old London and remaining loyal to the conclave and to Dearon, she strikes a compromise with the Elderman that allows her to return temporarily to the city.

There she sets about solving the mystery of Tim's many deaths with the help of her apprentice, Karrion. They come to realise that with every death, more of the echo becomes reality, and Yannia and Karrion find themselves in increasing danger as they try to save Tim. Who is the echo murderer? What sinister game are they playing? And what do they truly want?

"What could Lady Bergamon have to fear in a garden of her own making?"


On the night of Samhain, the veil between worlds is at its thinnest, and ancient magic runs wild in Old London.

Yannia Wilde arrives in rural Sussex to attend her friend Jessika's aristocratic Mage wedding. When two butchered doves are left in the hotel dining room, Yannia volunteers to take charge of the investigation. More disturbing events follow, leaving Yannia convinced that somebody is trying to sabotage the wedding.

Yannia teams up with the groom, Robbert, a wheelchair-using fan of detective fiction, and Wishearth, her ever-loyal Hearth Spirit, who surprises her by taking an active role in the investigation. But as the clock ticks towards the big day, the sabotage continues and the contradictions mount. The case turns sinister when Yannia herself is targeted, and Wishearth has to act quickly to rescue her. But can they solve the mystery and save the wedding before somebody loses their life?

A "sideways" novella in the Wilde Investigations series, this is Laura's homage to the classic detective fiction of Agatha Christie and Arthur Conan Doyle.





Helen Kitson


"So much of life is about pretending to be something other than what one is: prettier, cleverer, less ordinary."

In the Sweep of the Bay Cath Barton


"They forgot the happiness. Or rather, pushed it away. But it was there, all their lives, waiting to surprise them."



Mrs Narwhal's Diary S J Norbury




